### **3<sup>RD</sup> ANNIVERSARY ACCESS WEEKEND AT THE MARE ISLAND SHORELINE HERITAGE PRESERVE FREE GUIDED HISTORIC SHORELINE AND WILDFLOWER HIKES ON SATURDAY**

[VALLEJO], CA – April 9, 9am to 7pm is the 3<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of regular public access to the Mare Island Shoreline Heritage Preserve. The traditional 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday Access Day is hosted by Mare Island Heritage Trust. The Preserve is now open three days a week Friday through Sunday 10am-sunset staffed by volunteers. Once the only open day at the Preserve, the 2nd Saturday continues a special day of programming including guided hikes to areas of the Preserve normally off-limits still to the public, and free activities and refreshments at the Visitors Center. The public is welcome to visit the Preserve free of charge.

A morning hike to the Historic Southshore led by Sierra Club hike leader Kenn Browne starts from Palmer's Hut at the Visitors Center at 9:30am. This will be Mr. Browne's last hike after more than 6 years of offering monthly guided hikes to the historic Navy Ammunition Depot shoreline area in an agreement between the Sierra Club and the U.S. Navy. There will be a potluck at 12noon at the picnic grounds following the hike to honor Mr. Browne's contribution to the Preserve. At 2pm a cake-cutting ceremony at the Preserve Visitors Center will mark the 3<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of regular public access to the Preserve. Brian Collett, Preserve naturalist will give a brief native plant ID class at the Visitors Center at 2:30pm before going out into the field for a naturalist-led wildflower walk. The Preserve is located at 1595 Railroad Ave. on Mare Island

During the open days the public can walk or ride bicycles on a self-guided paved roadway trail with 14 interpretive stops along the 3-mile roundtrip route to the top of the hill and beyond. The Preserve is open rain or shine. Dress in layers. A picnic area is available. Dogs are allowed on leash.

Although entrance to the Preserve is free, donations help to keep the Preserve open regularly. Donations will also make possible Preserve volunteer's ability to increase the number of open days in the future and provide funds for purchase of tools and supplies for work parties, nature club activities, historic preservation, native plant restoration and special events.

Key features of the Preserve are spectacular scenic vistas encompassing 7 Bay Area counties, Mt. Diablo, Mt. Tamalpais and Mt. St. Helena, the Carquinez Strait and Sonoma and Napa Valleys and the U.S. Navy's first cemetery in the Pacific, founded in 1858. Visitors may also view interpretive displays and an art show by members of the Benicia Plein Air Group portraying the Preserve at the Visitors Center in a former

munitions storage magazine, Building A-167. Visit [www.mareislandpreserve.org](http://www.mareislandpreserve.org) for directions to the Preserve, located at 1595 Railroad Ave. on Mare Island.

The first parcels of the Preserve, were transferred to the City of Vallejo in a grant from the legislature through the California State Lands Commission in 2002 for public trust uses such as a park, for all Californians. Additional parcels were transferred in the Fall of 2010. The remainder of the 215-acre site is still undergoing environmental cleanup by the U.S. Navy. Volunteers have hosted free public access on the second Saturday of each month since April 2008 with expanded hours to every weekend Fri-Sun beginning in October 2010 through a use agreement with the City of Vallejo.
